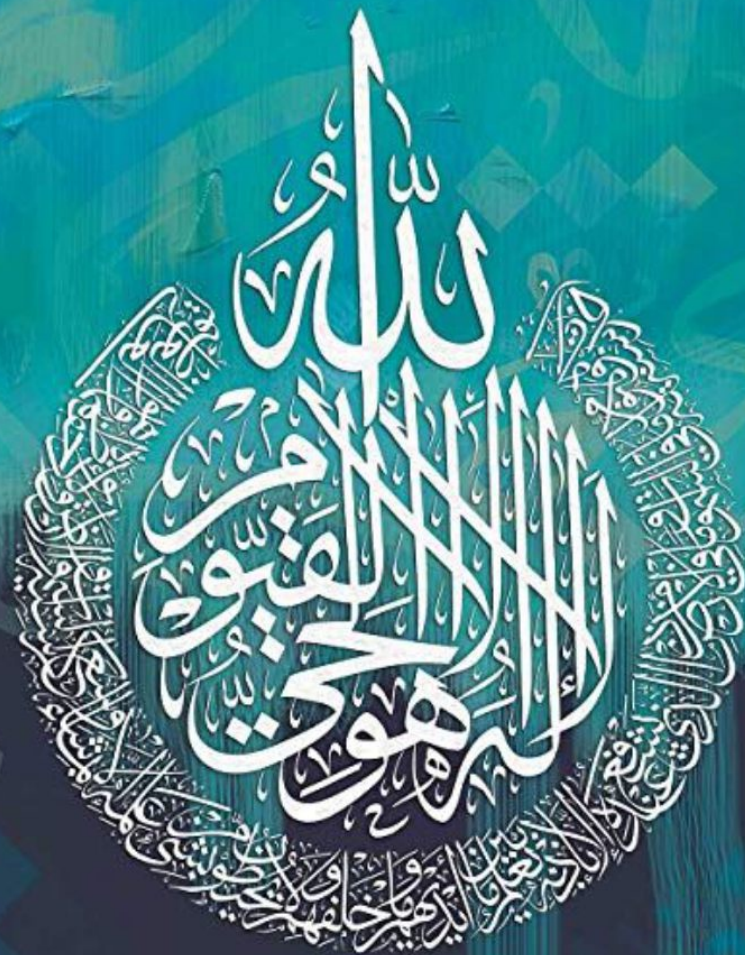

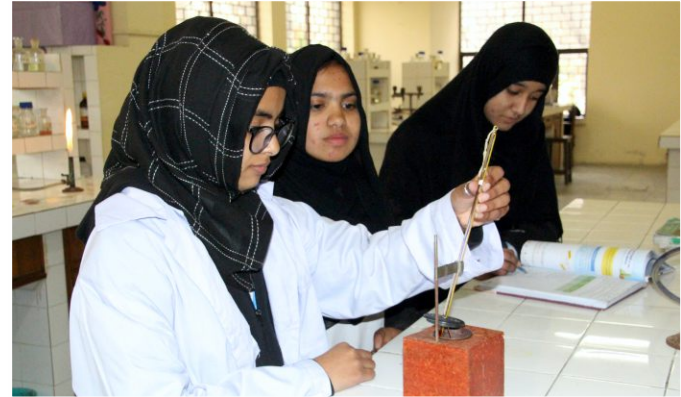
BIOLOGY LAB

LIBRARY

In an ideal educational institution classroom instructions and self-study in library go hand in hand. The library aims at providing the resources and environment to enhance students' learning experience. College library has a variety of reading material like books, journals, encyclopedias, periodicals and newspapers. A large number of reference books on various subjects is available for students and staff as well.

Library Rules

- ✓ College library cards will be issued to all enrolled students.
- ✓ Books are issued for a period of 15 days maximum.
- ✓ If a student retains books after the prescribed period, a fine of Rs. 20/- per day will be charged.
- ✓ The books may be re-issued to a borrower with permission of the librarian.

AVICENNA

MDC has shifted its administrative data on AVICENNA.

AVICENNA is the Campus Management System (CMS) of University of Wah that maintains and processes database and provides online academic/curricular records and students' results. It is a web-based application with multiple web browser support that manages all day-to-day activities of UW efficiently and securely across multiple departments, faculty, staff and students. AVICENNA is named after Ibn-e-Sina (c.980-1037), a great Persian Scholar of the Islamic Golden Age. AVICENNA CMS is indigenously developed by IT Team at University of Wah.

AVICENNA

Admission Policy

Admission forms will be available within a week after declaration of SSC result. The rules and regulations for admission are as follows:

1. Admission in Mashal Degree College is open to all candidates regardless of religion, race, creed, province or Board.
2. Admission in Mashal Degree College is granted on open merit basis.
3. College has the right to reject any application form for admission in any group/programme and no claim will be entertained against it.
4. Applications for admission are received on prescribed admission forms attached with the prospectus available at the College admin office on payment.
5. The application for admission, complete in all aspects, should reach the Admission Office of Mashal Degree College within due date.
6. All the documents attached with the application form must contain correct information and should be attested by a Class-I Officer/Gazetted Officer (the detail of the required documents is given on the application form).
7. Any Admission Form containing incorrect or false information shall stand rejected forthwith (at any time during the session) and the fee and other dues deposited shall be forfeited.
8. All candidates are to opt for one group of subjects. A candidate who wishes to apply for more than one group shall have to submit a separate form for each group.
9. List of candidates eligible for admission will be displayed on college notice board after clearance by the Admission Committee.
10. Incomplete forms will be rejected.
11. The candidates will be considered “enrolled” as college students after the signature of the concerned authorities on the paid bank receipt.
12. All the admissions will be provisional till the acceptance from the Federal Board.
13. Submission of an application form does not necessarily qualify an applicant for admission.
14. Admission will be done strictly on merit as per the College policy and the pre-requisites defined by FBISE for Intermediate.
15. The class in any subject will commence if the number of students is not less than fifteen.
16. Twenty additional marks (in overall merit) will be given to Hafiz-e-Quran candidates on provision of certificate/testimonial.
17. A student can change group/subjects, within 15 days after commencement of classes, on recommendation of the Admission Committee, subject to the availability of a seat (change of group/subject is not a matter of right but a privilege offered by the College).

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM

The Associate Degree Program is a Regular 2 years program in which students are offered a combination of any two areas from the desired disciplines, Science, Arts and Commerce. After successful completion of two years Associate Degree, a student has an option to continue in BS program.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

The objectives of Associate Degree Program are:

- ✓ To provide students with a broad base and academic foundation of multidisciplinary programs.
- ✓ To provide students comprehensive knowledge in any selected discipline.
- ✓ To reflect a general understanding of the concepts and principles of selected areas of the study thus providing Students an opportunity to decide the specialization fields for making professional choices.

ADP DISCIPLINES:

MDC offers ADP in the following disciplines.

- ✓ Science
- ✓ Arts
- ✓ Commerce

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- ✓ Intermediate (equivalent to 12 years of education) with at least 45% marks.
- ✓ Candidates having 'A' level are required to provide an equivalence certificate from Inter Boards Coordination Commission, Islamabad.

PROGRAM DURATION:

It is a two year full time study program spread over four semesters with prescribed 64-68 credit hours. Each semester has 18 weeks duration for teaching and examination.

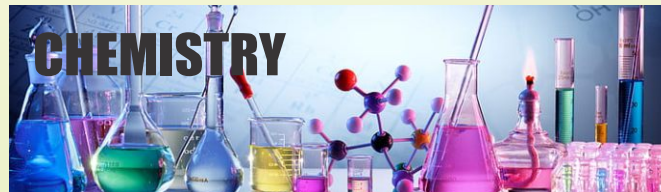

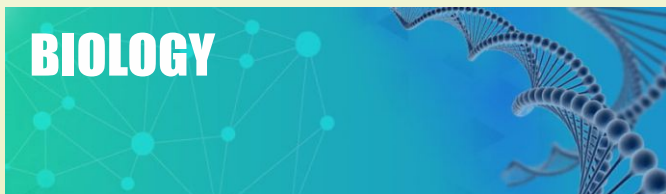

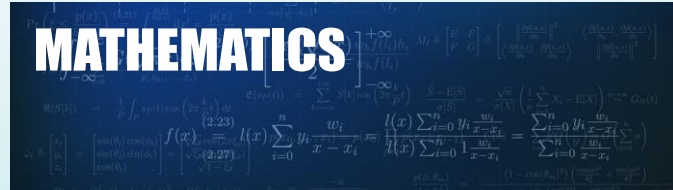

Rules & Regulations

DISCIPLINE RULES

College Discipline Committee comprises the Vice Principal and the nominated lecturers. It observes, reviews and scrutinizes all serious lapses regarding discipline before any final action is taken against any student. The decision of the College Discipline Committee is irrevocable.

1. Uniform must be proper.
2. Jewellery and make-up is not allowed.
3. Regularity in attendance is compulsory.
4. Punctuality must be strictly observed. In case of coming late, a fine of Rs. 10/- per day will have to be paid.
5. In case of bunking class, student will be punished as decided by the concerned Lecturer/Discipline Committee.
6. Students will have to produce college Identity Cards as and when demanded.
7. Pilfering, damaging or breaking the furniture, fittings, or other property of college will lead to face penalty/fine.
8. Sticking/pasting bills on any part of any movable/immovable property of college as well as chalking is strictly prohibited.
9. Students are prohibited to take part in politics or activities prejudicial to nature of aspirations.
10. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in college premises during college timings.

11. Silence must be observed particularly inside and near academic blocks.

12. Staying in reading rooms or outside in lawns and hanging around verandas during class is not allowed.

13. Visitors are not allowed to see students during class. Proctors may check and ask visitors to leave college premises if their presence is considered undesirable.

14. Any student who wilfully violates college rules will be subjected to expulsion, restriction, suspension or any other disciplinary action as deemed fit by college authority.

LEAVE RULES

1. Leave will be sanctioned by the Principal.
2. Applications duly signed by the parents/guardians should be submitted through class incharge.
3. Sick leave must be supported by Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner.

SEND-UPS/PRE-BOARD EXAMS

College abides by the rules levied by FBISE, Islamabad for Intermediate classes.

1. The student who fails to qualify at least three major subjects in Part-I shall stand disqualified forthwith.
2. For sending admission to the Board, 75% attendance is a pre-requisite. Mashal Degree College gives due importance to the December / January Tests and Pre-Board Examination. The College administration has the authority to withhold admission (to the Federal Board)

of a student who fails the examinations or whose attendance is less than the required percentage.

3. Students will be charged with a fine of Rs. 200/- per subject if they are absent in these exams (December/January Test, Pre-Board) without any prior

FEE DEPOSIT RULES

1. The students will have to deposit fee in the bank using a voucher provided by the Accounts department.
2. Fee once paid is non-refundable.
3. College leaving certificate is issued after the clearance of all dues.
4. Fee must be paid quarterly, if a student fails to pay fee by the due date she will be fined as per late fee submission rules. Without clearance of dues, admission will not be sent to the Board/University.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

1. Simple white shalwar and simple white shirt (knee length with slip and coat collar).
2. No laces are allowed.
3. Students are provided with coloured dupattas for their respective class/year along with the identity cards by college.
4. Half sleeves are not allowed.
5. Shoes must be black and without heels (open shoes are not allowed).

6. Students have to wear black sweater or black coat in the winter season.

MONTHLY TESTS

1. Class tests of each subject will be taken after each week.
2. Sessionals would be held after every two months to evaluate the major part of the courses, final evaluation will be based on results of these tests and sessionals.
3. Proper record of each student's performance is maintained and parents are kept informed of their performance.
4. In case of absence during monthly tests, the student will be considered fail and charged a fine of Rs. 200/- per subject.

PAYMENT OF FINE

1. A fine of Rs.10/- per day will be charged if a student remains absent from classes.
2. In case of absence for 2 weeks (without application duly approved) the name of student will be struck off the college roll. However, if such a student applies for re-admission, college may grant this facility subject to payment of admission fee.
3. If a student breaks/damages college property she will be charged calculated price of the item / material.

PARENTS TEACHER MEETING

Efforts made by the college authorities for the betterment of students will be more effective if parents/guardians join hands with Teachers/Administration. For this purpose, Parents Teacher meetings are arranged from time to time and the role of the parents in this respect is very significant.

Rules & Regulations (ADP)

1. Title and Extent of Application:

- ✓ These Regulations may be called “Examination Regulations for Academic Programs at University of Wah, Pakistan”.
- ✓ The University of Wah reserves the right to make appropriate amendments in these Regulations as and when necessary. Such amendments shall govern all University students admitted under these Regulations.

2. Definitions:

- ✓ Academic Program: An “Academic Program” means a program of studies, which leads to the award of University Degree to enrolled student after successful completion of all its requirements.
- ✓ Academic Year: An academic year shall consist of two regular semesters (Fall and Spring) and one non-regular semester (Summer), which is optional.
- ✓ Semester: A “Semester” means a declared duration of 20 weeks for regular semesters, and 10-12 weeks in case of summer semester including teaching, examination and semester break.
- ✓ Course: A “Course” means a course of studies as prescribed in the detailed syllabi approved by the Competent Authority and successful completion of which shall be the requirement of the degree.
- ✓ Credit Hour: A “Credit Hour” means 1 hour of theory lecture or 3 hours of practical work for lab courses per week in a semester.
- ✓ Grade: A “Grade” means the letter grade earned by a student in a course depending on his/her performance.
- ✓ Grade Points: “Grade Points” means the numerical score associated with each letter grade.
- ✓ Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): “SGPA” means the credit hour weighted average of the Grade Points earned for all the courses in a semester.
- ✓ Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): “CGPA” means the credit hour weighted average of the Grade Points earned for all the courses in all the semesters attended.
- ✓ Mid-Semester Examination: “Mid-Semester Examination” means the examination to be held after 8-9 weeks of teaching in case of regular semesters and after 4-5 weeks of teaching in case of summer semester on dates that the University notifies.
- ✓ End-Semester Examination: “End-Semester Examination” means the examination to be held at the end of each semester on dates that the University notifies.
- ✓ Academic Deficiency: “Academic Deficiency” means that a student fails to meet the required GPA/CGPA and/or has yet to pass “F”/“D” grade(s).
- ✓ Minimum Residency: “Minimum Residency” means minimum number of academic years/semesters that must be attended by the student to complete the degree program.
- ✓ Maximum Residency: “Maximum Residency” means maximum number of academic years/semesters permissible to complete the degree program. Further, beyond the maximum residency the student shall cease to be on the University roll.

Rules & Regulations (ADP)

3. Freezing/Dropping of Semester:

- ✓ A student, choosing not to register for a semester, on her written request made to the Chairperson and approved by the Dean of concerned Faculty before the commencement of that semester, shall deem to have frozen the semester.
- ✓ A student freezing a semester before registration of courses shall be required to pay 5% tuition fee of the semester for continuation of the program.
- ✓ A student, after registering for a semester, if chooses not to continue that semester, then on her written request made to the Chairperson before the start of End-Semester Examination, shall deem to have dropped that semester. The written request may be approved by the Chairperson/Dean of the Faculty concerned before the start of End-Semester Examination. It shall be duly notified by the office of the Dean with intimation to all concerned.
- ✓ The deposited fee of the dropped semester shall not be refunded or carried forward for the semester on resumption of studies as per rules.
- ✓ A student may be allowed to drop/freeze a maximum of two semesters in his/her academic program.
- ✓ The dropped/frozen semester(s) for ADP, the dropped/frozen semester(s) shall be counted towards the maximum residency.
- ✓ If a student remains absent for more than 30 consecutive days in a semester without any valid reason(s) she shall be deemed to have dropped that semester.

4. Examinations:

- ✓ Conduct of Examinations: The examinations of the University will be conducted under the auspices of examination office and shall be held according to the Date Sheet as notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- ✓ Practical Examination: Practical examination of lab courses will be held as per schedule given by the department with the approval of the Controller of Examinations.
- ✓ Sub-groups in Practical Examination: For the purpose of practical examination, the Chairperson of the Department may divide candidates into sub-groups on the recommendation of the course instructor.

5. Course Evaluation:

A student shall be evaluated in each course on the basis of aggregate marks obtained through Assignments, Quizzes, Mid-semester Examination, Semester Project and End-semester Examination as per the following weightage:

6. Result Submission:

After End-Semester Examination, the instructor will generate the result sheet through AVICENNA and, with the endorsement of Chairperson and Dean, submit the final sheet to the examination office within five days of the respective examination paper. The instructor shall also submit the marked answer books, exam attendance sheet and a copy of question paper along with the grade sheet.

7. Examination Eligibility:

A student shall be eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examination provided that:

- ✓ She has been on the University roll during that semester.
- ✓ She has registered herself for the courses of studies and attended not less than 80% of the lectures delivered in that course.
- ✓ The Vice Chancellor may condone the deficiency up to 5% of the required attendance on the recommendation of respective Dean and Chairperson. The students falling short of required/mandatory attendance shall not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination of the concerned course and shall be treated as having failed in that course.
- ✓ Any student, who has not paid her fees, shall not be allowed to sit in the Mid-Semester Examination and End-Semester Examination.
- ✓ Students with special needs will be provided a writer by the University on the recommendation of Chairperson of the Department concerned. The writer shall be having a level of education lower than that of the candidate. She would be allowed 45 minutes over and above the stipulated time for solving the question paper.

8. Grades and Promotion:

- ✓ The minimum passing marks for each course shall be 50%. A student obtaining 40% to 49% marks in a course shall be awarded 'D' grade only for the purpose of promotion to the next semester, however, it is mandatory on the part of student to improve the "D" grade.

Rules & Regulations (ADP)

- ✓ A student failing to complete required credits in maximum residency of the program (i.e. 6 academic years for BS/BBA/BSAF/BS Engineering Technology and 7 academic years for BSc Engineering) shall cease to be the student of the University.
- ✓ A separate transcript for the period of studies will also be issued to student on request showing the credits completed and grades obtained in courses on the payment of transcript fee. Transcript will bear the signatures of the Controller of Examinations. However, Provisional Certificate will be signed by the Controller of Examinations and the respective Dean.
- ✓ There shall be no re-evaluation of answer books. A student may, on payment of prescribed fee, within thirty days from the date of declaration of the result, get the answer books re-checked for any numerical error like transfer of marks and/or totaling which will be done by the examination office; however, for the discrepancy like unmarked question/portion, the case will be sent to the Chairperson of the concerned department. Errors and omissions, if any, shall be rectified.
- ✓ The answer books used in the examination and the students' attendance sheets will be disposed off after a period of one year.

9. Grading System:

The students are awarded grades i.e., A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, D and F as per following equivalance:

- ✓ The "D" grade is mandatory to be improved for becoming eligible for the award of degree.
- ✓ Incomplete (I) grade is not counted in calculation of CGPA.

10. Conduct of Viva Voce:

Viva Voce Examination date will be announced by the department concerned.

11. Probation:

a. Type-I

- ✓ A student shall be placed on Type-I Probation if his/her CGPA is between 1.75 and 1.99 (both inclusive).
- ✓ Student shall be promoted to next semester.
- ✓ Student must achieve minimum of 2.00 CGPA within the probationary year along with improving the deficient courses (F & D grades).
- ✓ 2 consecutive Type I Probations would amount to a Type II Probation.

Rules & Regulations (ADP)

b. Type-II

- ✓ A student shall be placed on Type-II Probation if her CGPA is less than 1.75.
- ✓ Student shall not be promoted to next semester.
- ✓ Student must achieve minimum of 2.00 CGPA within the probationary year along with improving the deficient courses (F & D grades).
- ✓ 2 consecutive Type II Probations would amount to struck off from the UW rolls.

12. Dismissal:

- ✓ “Academic Dismissal” implies that the student is removed from the University nominal roll and ceases to be a registered student of the University due to academic deficiency.
- ✓ A student will undergo academic dismissal if she fails to achieve a CGPA of 2.0 at the end of academic year in which he/she was placed on Type-II Probation. A student who does not attend two semesters and is not in contact with the University management her name shall be struck off from the roll of the University; however, she may seek re-admission in the same semester(s) as and when offered.

13. Fresh Admission:

Admission in the first semester, without going through the admission process, is granted to only those undergraduate students who have been dismissed on academic grounds but only for once as fresh admission.

14. Incomplete (I) Grade:

- ✓ A student may be awarded “I” grade in a course, if she cannot take the End-Semester Examination due to permissible reasons (accidental/medical/religious) reported timely. The Chairperson of the concerned department shall decide whether the reason was permissible or not. The appeal may be filed with the Dean of faculty concerned whose decision shall be final.
- ✓ A student awarded “I” grade in a course may appear in the End Semester Examination of that course whenever held in a summer semester and/or when the examination schedule makes it possible for the student to take the examination after completing the requirements which make her eligible to appear in the examination to the said course. However, in such case, the student’s previous attendance and pre-final results of semester exam and quizzes/assignments (sessional work) shall stand valid.

15. Repeating Courses/Improving Grades:

- ✓ If a student obtains “F”/”D” grade in any course, she shall have to repeat that course. Similarly, whenever a student obtains a grade lower than “B”, she can improve the grade.
- ✓ An academically deficient student who is within minimum residency shall be allowed to repeat/improve the courses during summer semester only. While academically deficient casual student who has completed minimum residency shall be allowed to repeat/improve the courses either during summer semester or whenever teaching and examination schedule make it possible for her to register herself for the courses. In case of Repetition/Improvement of a course, the student shall

have to pay Course Registration and Examination Fee as prescribed by the University.

- ✓ As soon as student improves a course, the grade higher between original and the improved one shall be used for computation of CGPA. However, both original and the improved grades shall be displayed on the Transcript. It shall be noted that a student can only improve a grade lower than "B"; however, the improved grade will not exceed from "B".
- ✓ A student shall not be allowed to improve her CGPA once she attains minimum of 2.00 CGPA after minimum residency period, provided there is no "F"/"D" grade in courses required for the award of degree.
- ✓ A student may process her application if she wants to repeat the 1st year voluntarily.

16. Withholding of Program's Final Semester Result:

- ✓ The result of program's final semester examination of a student, who is allowed to appear in the final semester examination while carrying "F"/"D" grade courses in lower semesters, shall not be declared till she has cleared all courses of lower semesters. Her program's final semester result will be declared with the session in which she clears her last course of the degree program.
- ✓ The Dean may withhold the declaration of the program's final result of a student who has not met all the required conditions of the program.

17. Award of the Degree:

The University of Wah shall award the degree to the student who fulfills the following conditions:

- ✓ Has successfully completed/passed total credit hours/courses of the degree program within the prescribed duration of the degree.
- ✓ Has scored a final Cumulative Grade Point Average of not less than 2.00 out of 4.00.

18. Gold Medal:

- ✓ The student who secures 1st position in a degree program in terms of CGPA, will be awarded a gold medal and a certificate to this effect, provided that:
- ✓ She has obtained minimum CGPA 3.65/4.00 for UG Programs whereas for Graduate Programs, a CGPA of 3.75 is required.
- ✓ She did not fail/improve any course.
- ✓ She has completed the degree in minimum residency.
- ✓ She had a good conduct and behavior during the stay for the degree to be certified by the Dean concerned.
- ✓ In case of more than one student obtaining equal CGPA, decision will be made in favor of the student who obtained higher aggregate marks in the degree program; however, if such students obtain equal marks, gold medal will be awarded to all such contestants.

Rules & Regulations (ADP)

19. Convocation:

The University holds a formal convocation annually for the award of degrees and certificates to its graduates. The University may, however, issue Provisional Certificates/Academic Degrees (on payment of prescribed fees) during the interim period between the graduation of a student and holding of the next convocation.

20. Eradication / Controlling of Unfair Means during Examinations:

- ✓ In accordance with the functions of the University and the power and the duties of Academic Council as given in the University of Wah Act, 2009, Section 4 (e) and Section 23 (2)© respectively, the University has constituted an Unfair Means Control Committee to deal with the cases pertaining to use of unfair means by the students in examination as per prescribed regulations.
- ✓ All cases related to use of unfair means will be reported to the Unfair Means Control Committee through Controller of Examinations, UW for disposal. Students are urged to stay away from the use of unfair means and be familiar with the University policy on the subject.

Co-Curricular Activities

Mashal Degree College is contributing in developing literary, aesthetic and cultural awareness among students by providing them ripened opportunities to exhibit their potentialities. As students are encouraged to take part in co-curricular activities, therefore, various functions and competitions are organized by students' societies under supervision of the College Council.

STUDENTS' COLLEGE COUNCIL

Co-curricular activities play an important role in character building of students to develop their mental and intellectual abilities. In order to promote the abilities, college has divided students into four houses (Ayesha House, Zainab House, Khadija House, Amna House). The incharges and office bearers of societies have to ensure discipline after selection. Decision of the Principal is considered to be final and council arranges programs with assistance of the concerned society incharges. Functions are held under following societies:

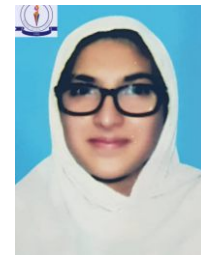
